Consultation Regarding Conservation Areas

Bramshaw Parish Council is very much in favour of the proposals, which we feel will help the policy of retaining the quality and interest of the area and, if the implications of being a conservation area mean tighter controls on the demolition and alteration of buildings or the cutting of trees, then this is to be very much welcomed.

We note, however, that Bramble Hill and Roundhills are not included. We would ask you to reconsider these two areas, which have a number of striking buildings (for instance Bramble Hill Hotel which was originally King John's Hunting Lodge) as well as some fine landscape.
