PLANNING FEES

1 Introduction

1.1 On 21 February 2017 the Authority received a letter from the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) as attached at Annex 1. The letter contains an offer to all Local Planning Authorities in England to increase planning fees by 20% from July 2017 on the condition that the additional funds are re-invested in the planning service.

2 Response

- 2.1 A 20% increase on planning application fees for this Authority would equate to around £50,000 a year, however as this will not be enacted until July 2017 the additional fees for 2017/18 would likely be around £40,000 this of course assumes the volume of transactions does not change from the expected amount.
- 2.2 Given the recent increases in planning application numbers and therefore workload, it is felt that this additional funding could be very timely to re-invest into the planning service to provide necessary additional staffing resources to the team. The exact details would need to be considered by Officers and Members over the coming months.
- 2.3 It should be noted that in our most recent planning cost benchmarking exercise, that the fees themselves only covered approximately 40% of the costs of determining the applications. Should this 20% uplift be applied, this figure will still be below 50% of the total costs. This proposal is not therefore a 'profit-making' or even 'cost-covering' increase and the Authority will still continue to have to use a significant portion of its Defra grant to cover its planning functions.
- 2.4 The date for replies to the DCLG letter was 13 March 2017; however Officers received agreement from DCLG that we could provisionally agree to the increase at that time, subject to final confirmation at this meeting.
- 2.5 The Authority will await details of the second proposal contained in the letter (fourth paragraph) that a further 20% increase on top of this could be applied for by those authorities who deliver the homes their communities need.

Recommendation

That the Authority formally accepts the Government's offer to raise planning fees by 20% from July 2017, with the additional income being re-invested in the Authority's planning service.
