May require some thinning – but for specific ‘structural’ objectives

May require some fencing changes in the future to make full connection



May just need to be left to its own devices.

- In line with SAC / SSSI designations;
- Fulfilment of programme committed through previous FDPs
- Additional areas identified to 'connect' heathlands and where soil type makes it unsuitable for native woodland.

Can require significant investment to 'clean out' seed trees after felling

Implemented through clear-felling at economic maturity

Once open, becomes part of the Open Forest





## Overview

Forest Plans define the long term (usually 50 to 100 years) vision for a woodland or a collection of woodlands and set out how management will move towards achieving this vision over the next 10 to 30 years.

The Forest Plan sets objectives for the woodland, taking into account requirements from the policy framework, local issues and outcomes from stakeholder consultations.

The document and maps will be available to download from 11th April for 12 weeks.

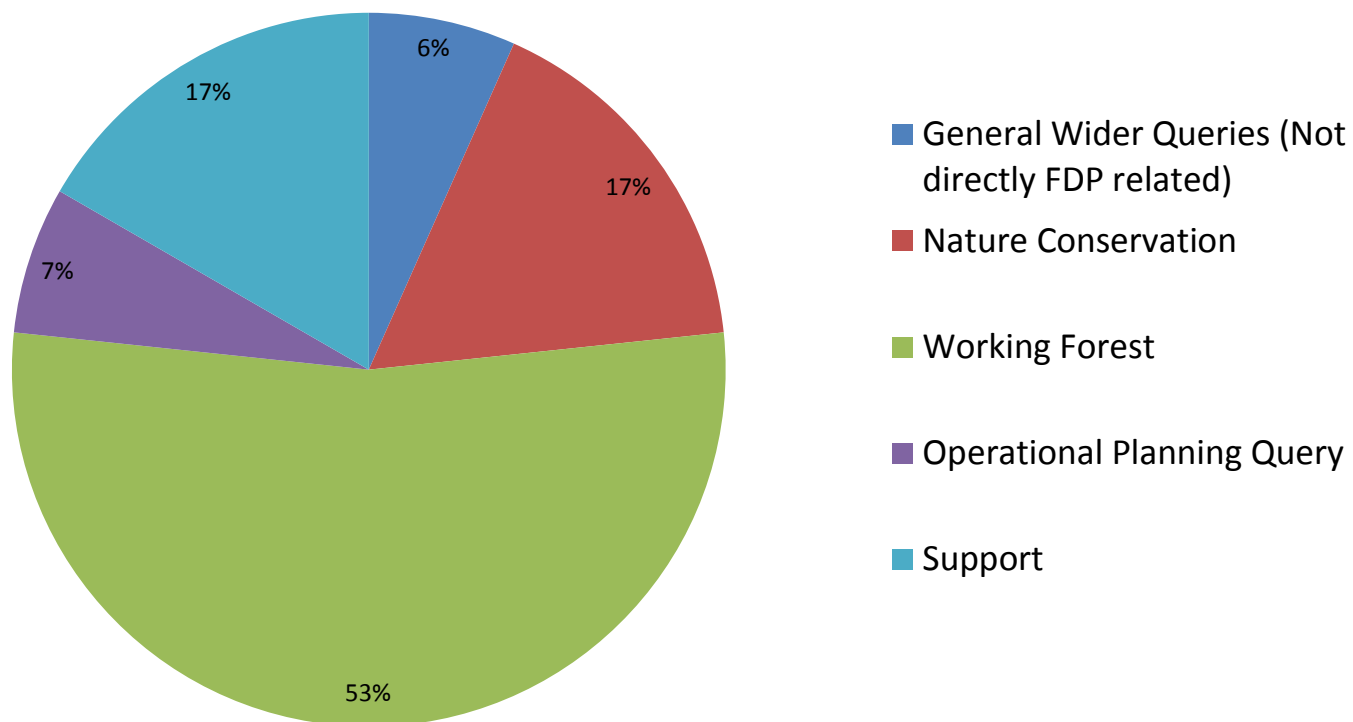

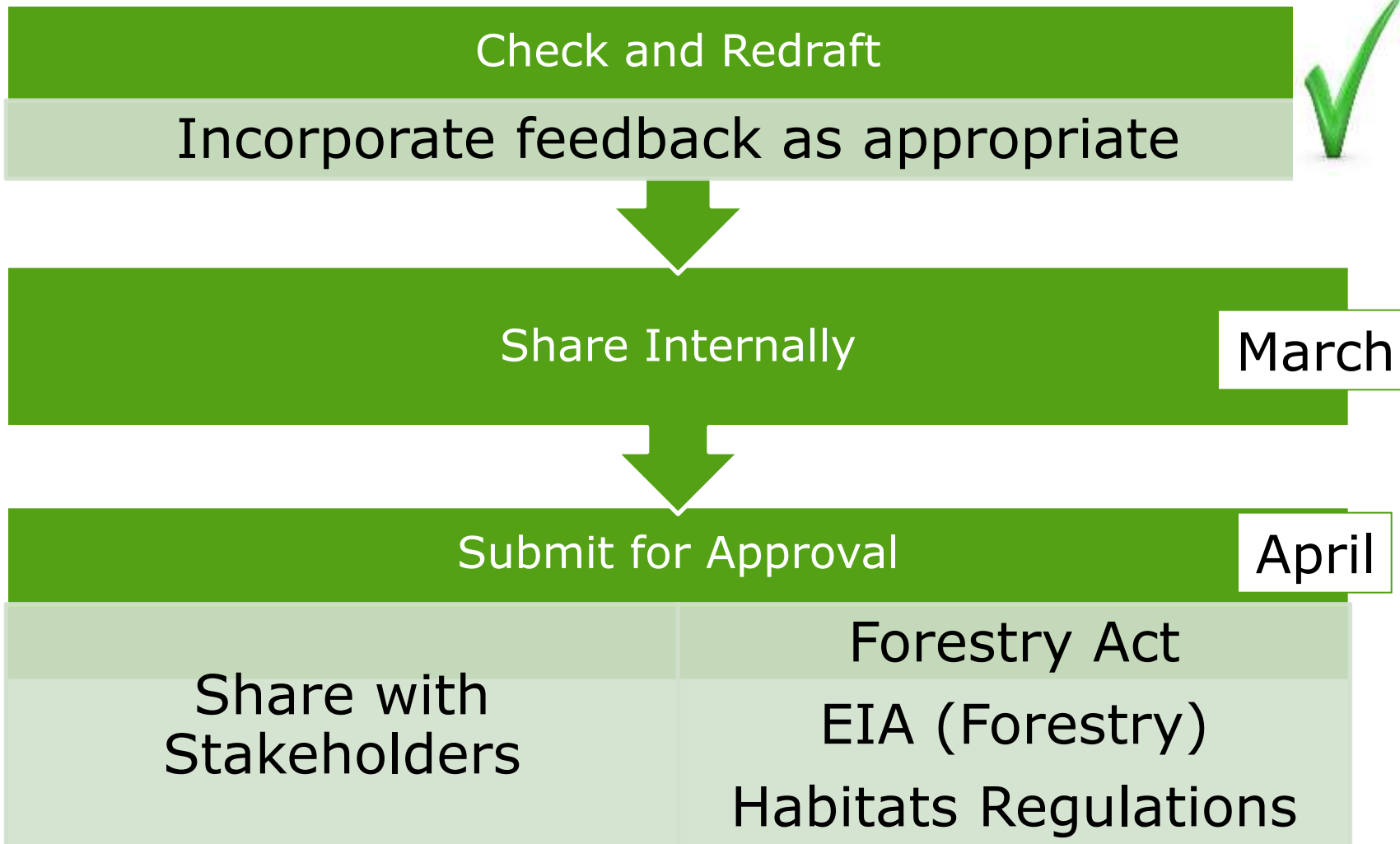
