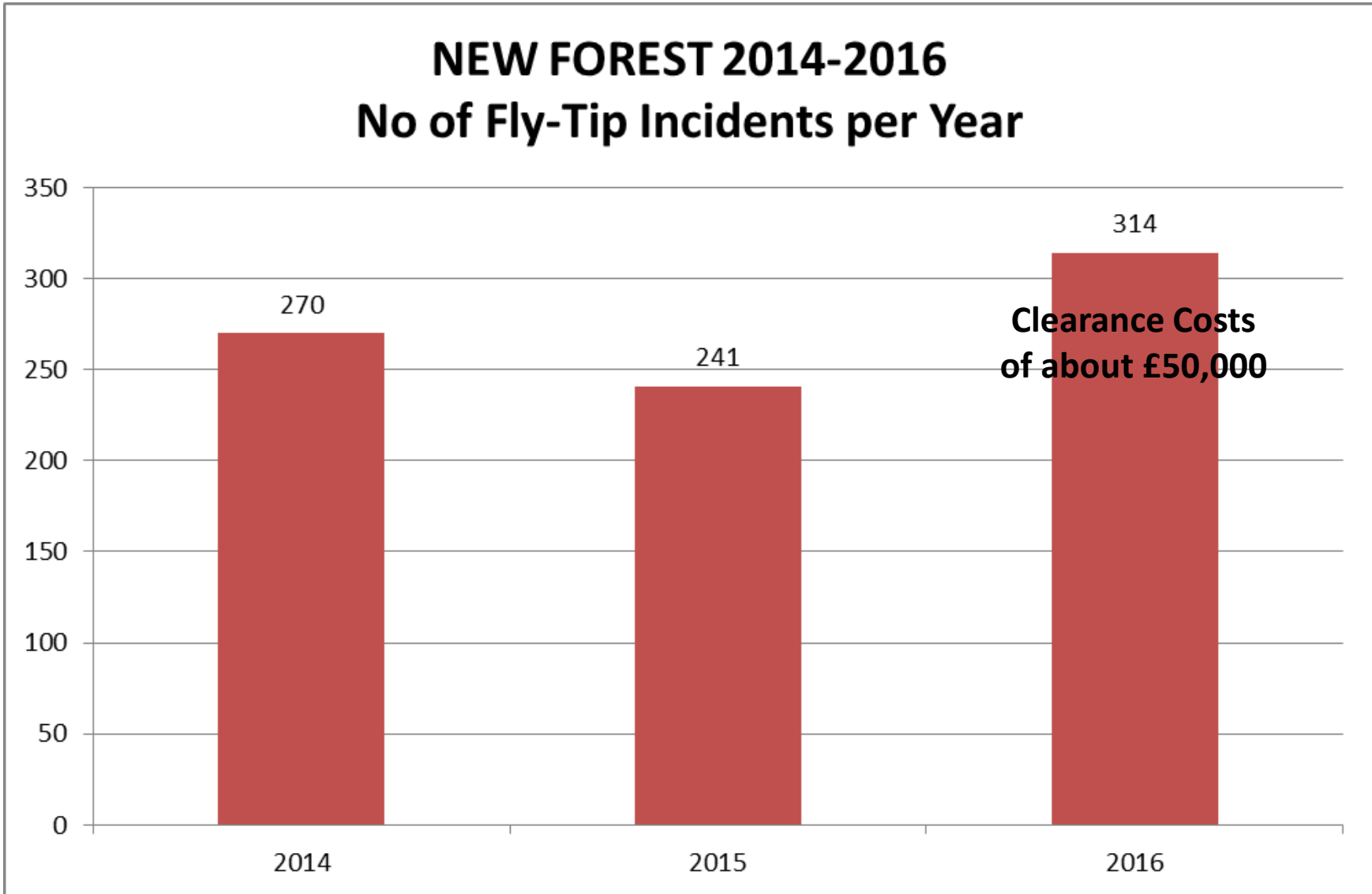
Fly-tipping Clean-up

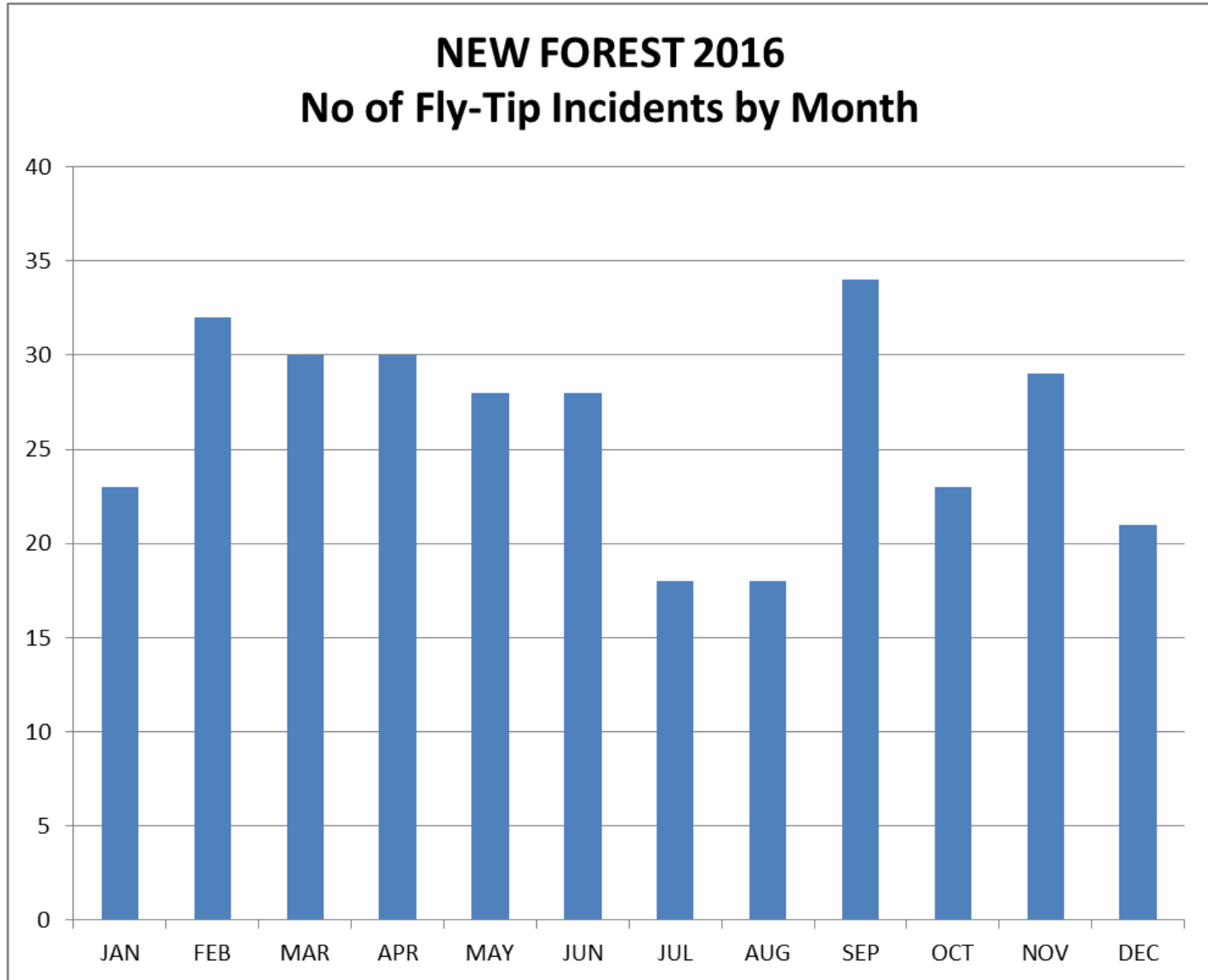
Costs dependent on amount of material

NEW FOREST 2014-2016 No of Fly-Tip Incidents per Year



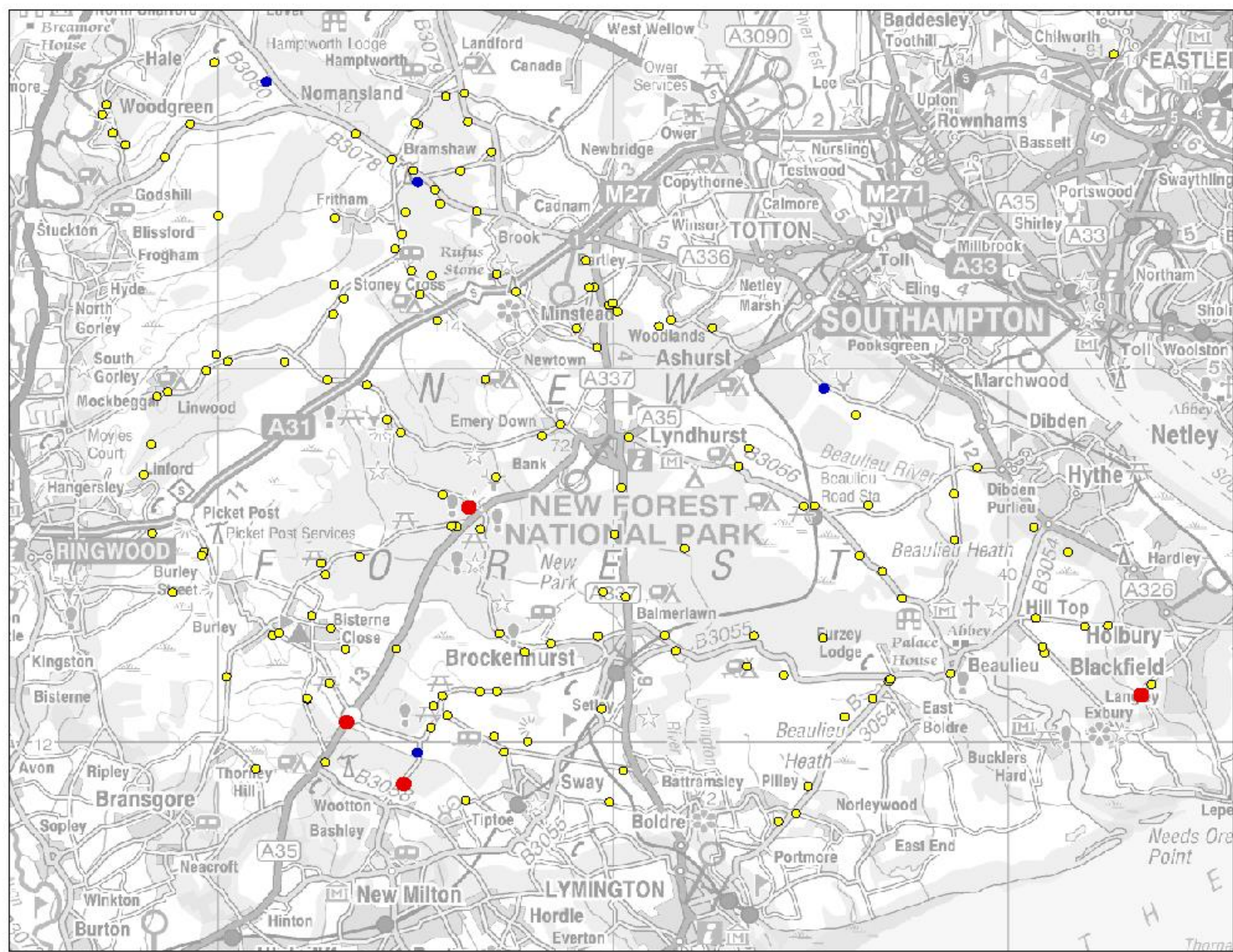




Flytips on FC Land by Location

Roadside habitats

Protecting the New Forest's grass verges

The New Forest is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, giving it national importance for nature conservation.

Vehicle damage can cause harmful impact to grass verges and can badly affect the landscape, ecological and grazing value of the area. By renewing ditches and banks we are taking preventative measures to help these roadside habitats to flourish.

The New Forest Higher Level Stewardship (HLS) scheme is working to protect the New Forest's habitats and grazing from the damaging impacts of unauthorised driving and parking along road verges.



We are working with parish councils to find ways to protect any verges around the Forest that are becoming eroded due to pressure from vehicles and other activities.
