- Extension of 40mph limit to Wiltshire area of the National Park






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Strategic Highways issues



- sharing road space, cars, livestock, cycles, pedestrians
- aesthetics of road markings/concrete kerbs etc
- Aesthetics of signage alongside highways. All signs, not just highway signs.
- Aesthetic impacts of road noise
- Management of verges, as safe places to ride horses together with the regulation of parking on verges.
- Roadside lighting, the aesthetic and wildlife impacts
- Management of trees (particularly veteran trees with high wildlife value) alongside the highway
- Management of invasive non-native species alongside highways (particularly Giant hogweed and Japanese knotweed.
- Road widening 'by stealth'
- Maintenance of culverts and highway drains
