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



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A day out in the New Forest

Getting in to the New Forest couldn't be easier with the fantastic rail, ferry and bus links from London, Bournemouth, Isle of Wight, Southampton and Salisbury. But the journey, and fun, really starts once you've arrived. Hop on board and ride through the treetops on the open-top New Forest Tour giving you the best opportunity to see and experience more.

With a choice of three routes (red, green or blue) which run daily from June to September, you can hop on and off wherever you like, catch the next Tour or switch between routes – all on the same ticket! There's even free travel


to the Tour on local buses and the Hythe ferry! Wherever you decide to pick it up, and on which route you wish to travel, is totally up to you but let's start in the wild northern heaths exploring Burley and Ringwood on the red route.

Morning

Breakfast to Burley

It's going to be a jam-packed day of exploration so you'll need a good hearty breakfast to set you up for the day. Step aboard the red route at Ashurst and head to Burley. Untouched by time and steeped in old customs, you can spend a few hours here relaxing in the tranquil atmosphere of picturesque thatched cottages and where the ponies roam freely here. Alternatively, choose to explore the mystery behind the smugglers and witches that once lived here, hire a bike, wander the village for local crafts or go on a deer safari – the morning will whizz by on any one of those activities.

For a pit stop, retreat to The Burley-licious for a white, pink or mint hot chocolate, milkshake or smoothie, or if cider is more your tipple visit the Cider Farm for a free tasting. Be sure to leave space for the famous Burley ice-cream as your visit wouldn't be complete if you didn't have one!

Lunchtime

A seafood delight

Hop back on the red route or hire a bike and cycle the five-mile journey to the market town of Ringwood and head straight for lunch at the Seven Fish. Whilst seafood based, it's not seafood exclusive and features simply prepared honest food with a welcoming atmosphere.

Afternoon

Fresh water or fresh air?

If you prefer to catch your own fish, take advantage of the excellent fishing and water sports in Ringwood. Cast your line off and see what your best catch of the day is or learn to wakeboard, kayak or paddleboard at the New Forest Water Park. And if that all seems like too much hard work, enjoy the afternoon browsing the shops, exploring the historic and quaint town or just delight in the flora and fauna of the surrounding area. A stroll around the Jubilee Gardens is a must!





Late Afternoon

Fuel your love for fine ales

A great way to end the day is with a visit to the Ringwood Brewery which has been brewing beer since 1978 and the founder of which, Peter Austin, has since become known and respected as 'the father of British Micro-brewing'. You'll have certainly worked up a thirst. After this, it's probably sensible to take the red route back to Ashurst - but don't worry, bikes can go on for free.

Your return journey on the red route will take you through the attractive town of Fordingbridge, past the eco-friendly Sandy Balls holiday resort.

Unfortunately you will have run out of time to discover these today but the audio guided commentary on board the Tour will bring this part of the New Forest to life and entice you to come back again.
