Quick History of an organisation born out of conflict

- Born in 2001 –
- Launched by Pauline Ludlow to fight a threat following the Foot & Mouth restrictions
- Involved in many New Forest forums
- Fought against the original NPA draft Plan & RMS
- Major protest meeting in October 2008
- Now working more closely with NFNPA & FC



NFDOG Mission Statement

We aim to maintain the privilege for our dogs:

"On the Forest Off the lead"

Note: Dogs should be under control at all times



From Re-active to Pro-active

If we can help to protect our Mission by working with the Authorities and the Community, then we shall do all we can to help promote responsible Dog Ownership.

It would be good to think that we shall never again have to fight for fair treatment



There are various perceived problems

However, the most visible to the general public is:

Dog "poo"





The Major Problem

What? Poo that can easily be walked on

Who? Inconsiderate Dog Owners

Where? Car Parks / Picnic Areas

When? All the year round

Why? Dogs loose inappropriately

How? We know that one!



Other Related Problems

"Poo" on Forest Paths / Tracks

"Poo" bags hanging in bushes

Not enough bins

Bins not cleared often enough

Disinclination to carry full "Poo" bags home

The Campaign

Produce posters and hand-outs
Launch & Press release at New Forest Show
Publish on websites & obtain links from others
Introduce at different meetings
Rangers target specific car parks
Involve Schools and children



Do's and Don'ts

(included in leaflet)

Do: Keep dogs in the car until ready to walk
Keep your dogs under close control until well
away from the car park / picnic area
Watch closely to see what they do
Pick up and bag around car parks/picnic areas
Bin it where you can
Stick & Flick 'poo' on paths



Do's and Don'ts

(included in leaflet)

Don't:

Leave bags full of 'poo' around the Forest Stick & Flick 'poo' where people might walk Be embarrassed to 'spread the message'
