## Why we must change

We have been reviewing our recycling and rubbish collection services and developing a new waste strategy for the New Forest in line with the government's objectives.

Increase recycling rates

Reduce carbon footprint

Current service does not encourage waste minimisation

Comply with government's future direction

Provide a wider range of recycling services

Improve the cleanliness of the district's streets

Reduce the quantity of single-use sacks distributed per year

## How have we developed the strategy

The development of our waste strategy has been informed by:

- government consultations
- •an initial resident survey, early 2020
- •our draft waste strategy, approved in November 2020
- •a formal period of engagement, late 2020 where residents, our staff, and other stakeholders provided feedback on the Draft Waste Strategy
- •Hampshire's new <u>Joint Municipal Waste Management Strategy</u>, which will see us working with councils in Hampshire to manage the county's waste. We approved the strategy in October 2021
- •looking at best practice from top-performing councils from comparable areas in England.
- ongoing feedback from members and staff



## **Key objectives**

#### **Objective 1**

Minimise carbon impact of waste/recycling service

• We are committed to taking all possible measures to help tackle climate change.

#### **Objective 2**

Reduce levels of overall household waste

 Waste reduction remains top of the waste hierarchy; therefore, we must implement all possible actions proven to reduce levels of waste

#### **Objective 3**

*Increase quality and quantity of recycling* 

• Future recycling rate targets set by the government, will not be met without service changes.


#### Objective 4

*Legislative and regulatory compliance*
