



**TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (GENERAL PERMITTED DEVELOPMENT)
(ENGLAND) ORDER 2015 (as amended)**

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF A NON-IMMEDIATE DIRECTION
PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 4(1) IN RESPECT OF ALL LAND
WITHIN THE NEW FOREST NATIONAL PARK**

TAKE NOTICE that the above mentioned Direction, made pursuant to Article 4(1) of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 (as amended, the **Order**), was confirmed by the New Forest National Park Authority (the **Authority**), being the appropriate local planning authority, on 8 April 2022.

THE DIRECTION will come into effect on **30 September 2022**.

THE EFFECT of the Direction is to withdraw permitted development rights within **Classes B and BA of Part 4 of Schedule 2 of the Order** across the whole of the New Forest National Park in respect of any development of land consisting of use of that land as a temporary campsite unless both of the following apply:

- The number of pitches at the temporary campsite numbers 50 or fewer; and
- The land was first used as a temporary campsite before 1 March 2020.

Once the Direction comes into effect, any development of land consisting of the use of that land as a temporary campsite as described above will not be permitted unless express planning permission is granted by the Authority.

The Authority consulted on the Direction between 27 September 2021 and 7 November 2021 and considered the representations made during this period.

The Direction and accompanying Plan have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of the New Forest National Park Authority, Town Hall, Avenue Road, Lymington, Hampshire, SO41 9ZG, between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Friday.
